

PREPAREDNESS: Pets

PLAN AHEAD

Meet with your vet to

- Microchip your pet with current contact info.
- Obtain medical records, vaccinations, and refill any prescriptions.

Ensure you have

- Up-to-date pet tags in a safe, sturdy collar.
- Proper transportation, items, and handling equipment (leashes, harnesses, pet carriers, etc.).

HAVE A DISASTER KIT

Basic needs

- Three days to two weeks supply of food and water and medication's in sealed containers.
- Bowls in any additional items, such as a manual can opener.
- Medical records and a first aid kit for your pet.
- Hygiene and grooming supplies, including sanitary items to clean up after your pet (litter, waste bags, etc.).

Ensure you have

- An up-to-date picture of you and your pet together to help prove ownership.
- Familiar items such as bedding, toys, and treats.

BE READY

• Have your supplies ready and accessible.

Call ahead!

- Know your destination and any stops you'll make. Ensure you have a back-up plan have a list of hotels, boarding, facilities, and shelters that allow you to bring your pets include contact info and addresses.
- Insure any where are you stay allows and is comfortable with all the pets you'll be bringing with you.
